• Members

- Drawn mainly from the primary UK wood supply chain seed to sawmill
- Subscriptions from c. 1,600 businesses
- Range from individuals @ £105 per annum to larger organizations @ £10,000 plus
- Turnover c. £1.3m
 - £370k from the growing sector
 - £520k from some 70 of the larger harvesting & wood processing businesses
 - Balance from administering FISA, UKWAS, TTF, Wood for Good, Climate Change Agreement,
- Board
 - 15 drawn from across the industry
- Staff
 - Chief Executive plus 12

Plant Passporting

- Has been required from 14 December 2019
- For the *movement* of timber from harvesting site to processor for
 - all conifers
 - *Castanea* (with bark) & *Platanus* (with or without bark)
 - Isolated bark from processor to bark processor
 - Xmas trees >3m & foliage from trees >3m
- **Register as a RAPO** (Registered Authorised Professional Operator)
- FC's Registered Forestry Trader system will be used initially
- The on the forestry e-learning webpages





Timber output and exit point survey 2019



Timber output and exit point survey 2019

- Scotland-wide refresh of 2014 survey;
- Gathers forecasts of timber production over next 15 years (in 5 year phases);
- Information used to justify STTS support/help target expenditure on public road network;
- Expectation that previous return rates will be exceeded (and be a minimum of 85%);
- Deadline for returns 30 November 2019;
