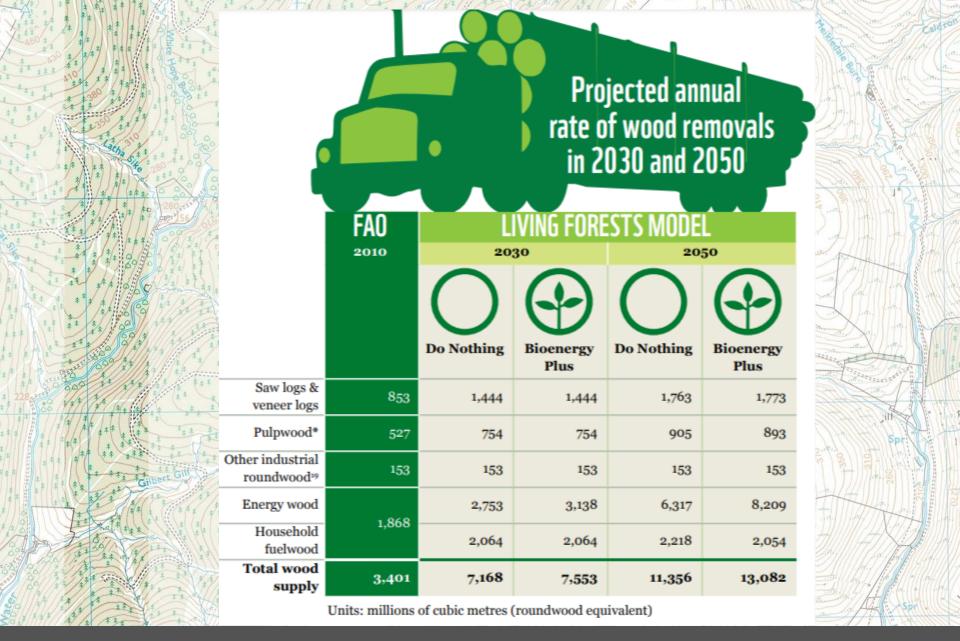




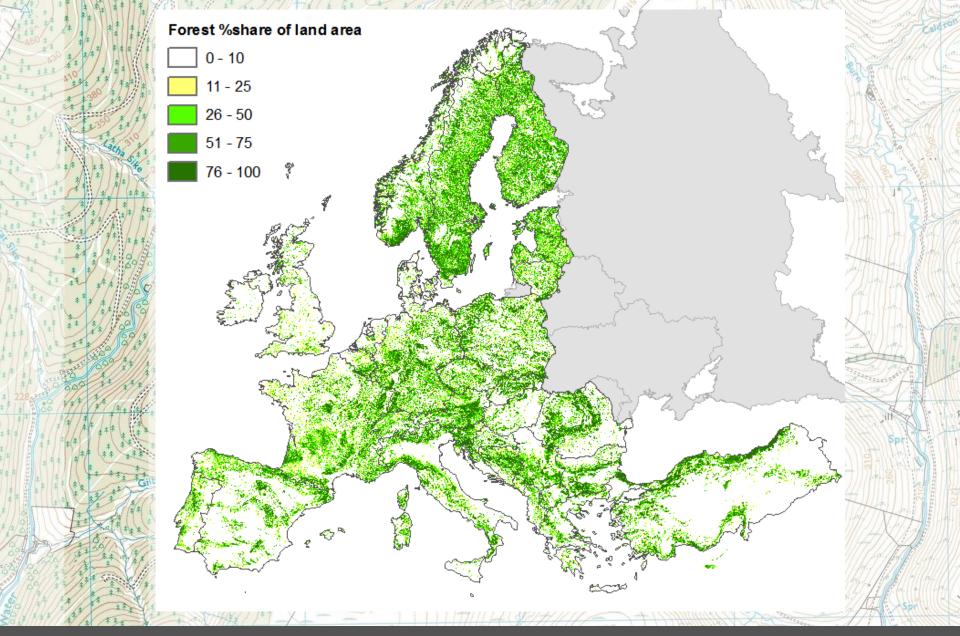
Timber Resources Overview

- Global demand for forest products will double by 2050
- UK 2nd biggest importer in the world
- UK has only 13% forest cover
- Over £60 Million per year invested in Scottish wood processing capacity











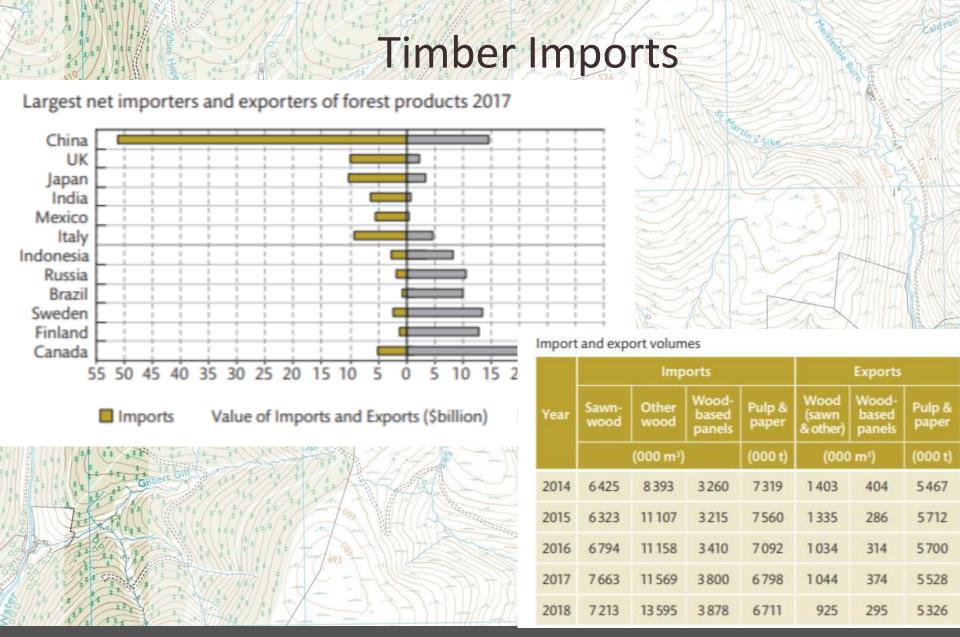


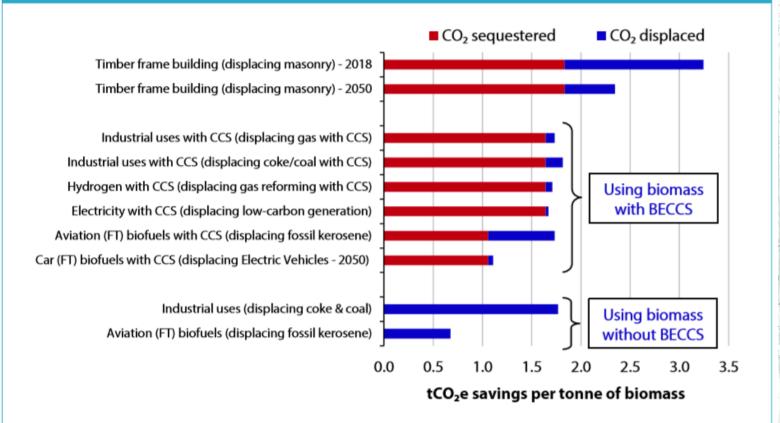








Figure B5.4. Estimated GHG abatement across different biomass applications

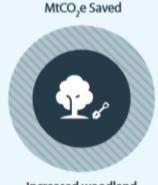

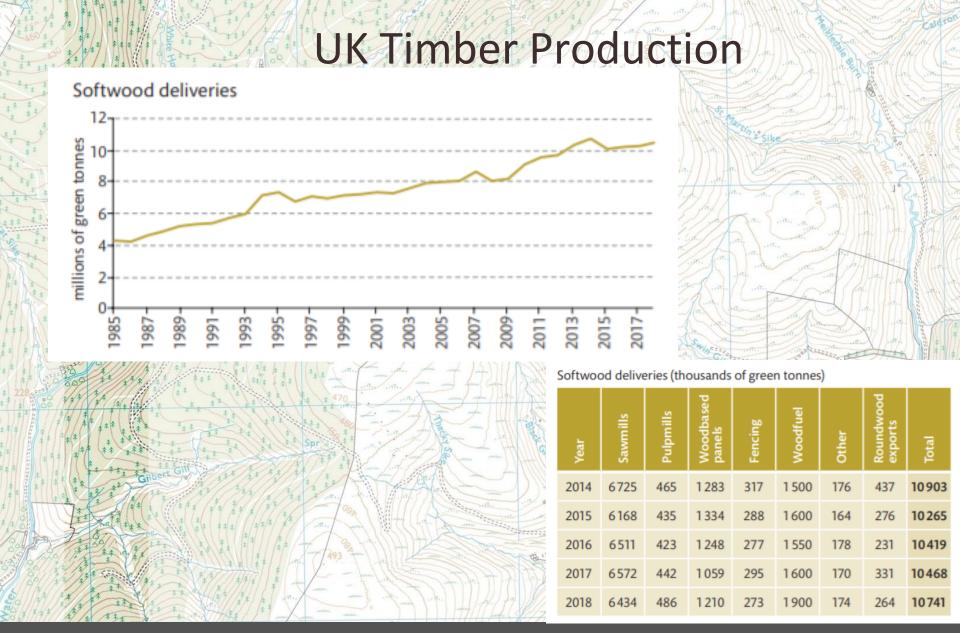

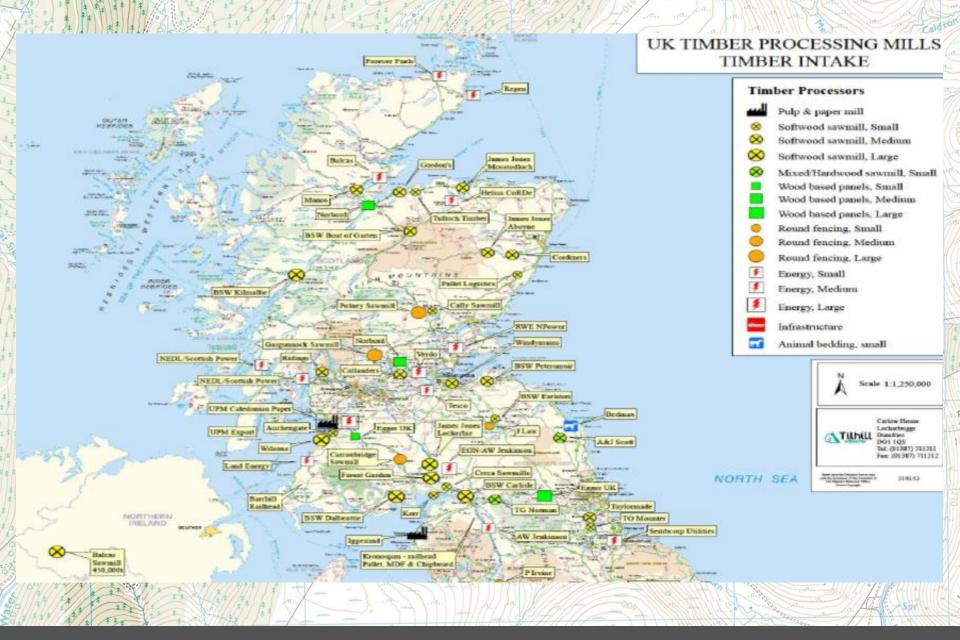

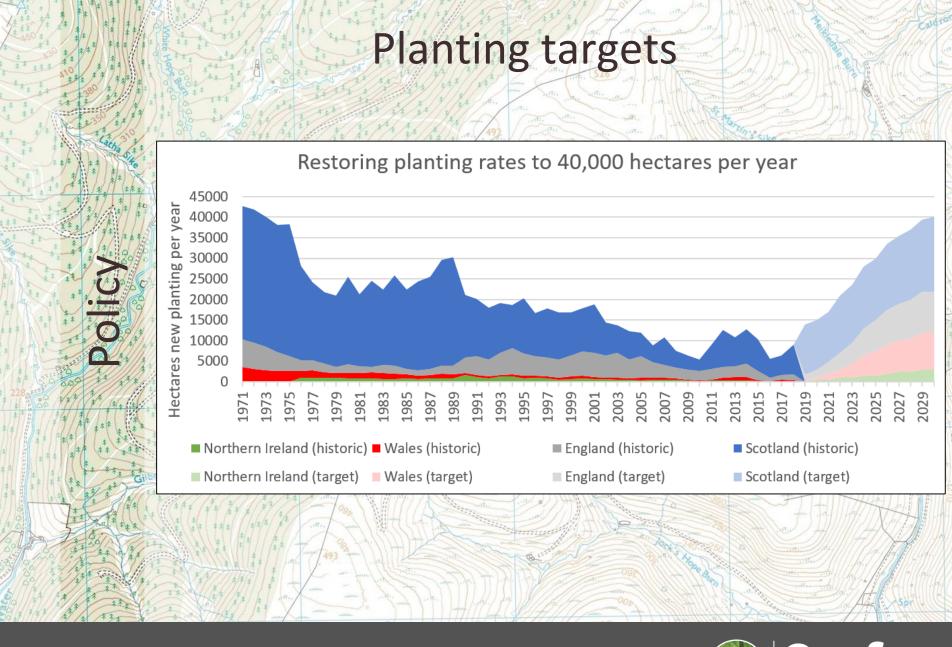

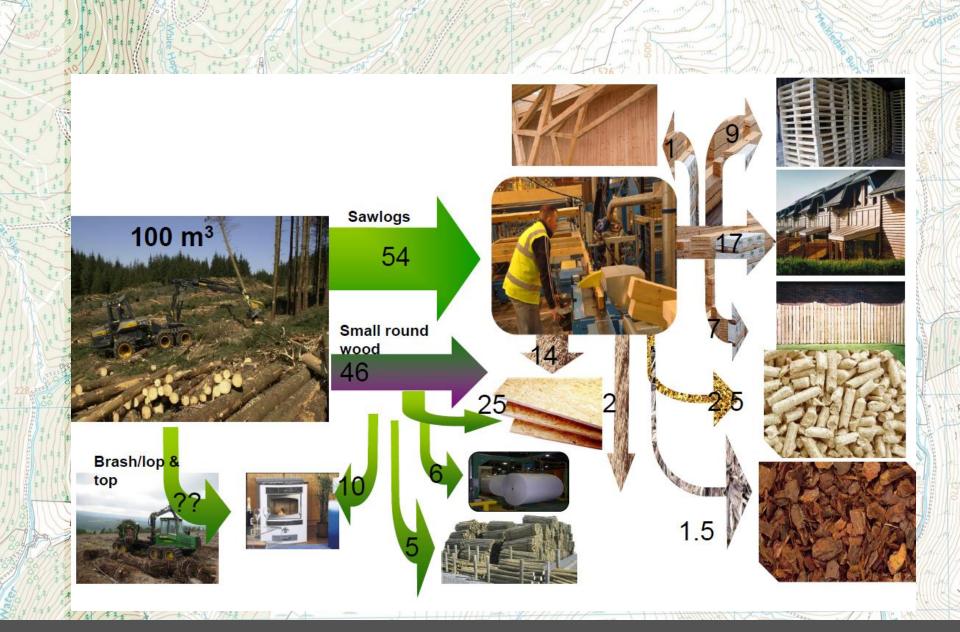
Figure 1 - 100 year forecast of GB Softwood Availability – the missing millions
